

## GLOSSARY OF TERMS

### ANTE

The initial wager that commences the game.

### BET

An additional wager that must be equal in value to your ante.

### ANTE BONUS

An additional payout made if you receive one of the top three hands.

### PAIRS PLUS

An additional bet that you may contribute to and qualify for on every hand by placing a wager in the pairs plus field.

## THE ODDS OF WINNING

Three card poker is a game of chance based on traditional Poker. The House margin for Three Card Poker is about 2.01% for skilled players.

## HOW TO PLAY THREE CARD POKER

Three Card Poker is based on the traditional Poker game where you play your hand against the House. The aim of the game is for your Poker hand to beat the Dealer's hand. If you draw one of the top three hands you will also be eligible for an additional ante bonus payout. You can also place a pairs plus wager which wins if you have any pair or higher.

To commence the game, you place a wager in the "ante" box. You also have the option of placing an additional wager in the pairs plus field. This makes you eligible for bonus payouts, in addition to the regular payout on your winning hand. After the initial ante stakes have been placed, all Players and the Dealer receive three cards face down.

### WILL YOU FOLD OR PLACE YOUR "BET"

Inspect your cards, without revealing them to the other Players or the Dealer. If you are not confident that your hand can beat the Dealer's, you may fold by placing your cards face down, in front of your box. If you think you may be able to beat the Dealer's hand, you may elect to play on by making an additional wager. This is known as your "Bet" wager - it must be equal to the value of your ante wager.

## THE DEALER'S HAND

After all Players have either folded or bet, the Dealer displays their hand. To qualify, the dealer must have an odd card hand containing either an Ace, King or Queen, or a higher ranked hand.

If the Dealer's hand fails to qualify, all ante wagers are paid at even money, and all bet wagers are considered void.

If the qualifying Dealer's hand is higher than your hand, you lose both your ante and bet wagers. If you beat the Dealer's hand, you will be paid even money on your ante and bet wagers.

## WINNING BET PAYOUTS

WAGER	PAYOUT ODDS
Ante	1 to 1
Bet	1 to 1

## ANTE BONUS HAND

If you hold one of the top three highest ranking Poker hands, you will receive an automatic payout called an ante bonus irrespective if the dealer's hand qualifies or not. This is paid at odds on the ante wager.

ANTE BONUS	PAYOUT ODDS
Straight Flush	5 to 1
3 of a Kind	4 to 1
Straight	1 to 1

## PAIRS PLUS

You can also make an optional bet called the "pairs plus" wager. You are not required to win in the main game to be paid on the pairs plus wager, provided the wager was placed prior to any cards being dealt. The pairs plus wager wins when your hand is any pair or better and is paid at the following odds:

PAIRS PLUS WAGER	PAYOUT ODDS
Straight Flush	40 to 1
3 of a Kind	25 to 1
Straight	6 to 1
Flush	4 to 1
Pair	1 to 1

## RANKING OF HANDS (highest to lowest)

RANK	HAND	EXAMPLE
1	Straight flush	Three consecutive cards of the same suit
2	3 of a kind	Any three cards of the same face value
3	Straight	Three cards of two or more suits running consecutively in face value
4	Flush	Any three cards of the same suit, but not running consecutively in face value
5	Pair	Any two cards of the same face value and one other odd card
6	Odd card hand	Any combination of three cards, other than any other Three Card Poker hand
